Don was one of nine children. His father owned a bar named Honey's that exposed Don to music at a young age. After attending college with a football scholarship and graduating with a sociology degree from University of Hawai'i, he entered the US Air Force and was stationed in Mississippi and California. In 1959, he returned to Hawai'i to take care of his mother and began singing at Honey's. He later moved the bar to Waikiki, where he was noticed by record companies. This led to performing in Las Vegas, Lake Tahoe, and New York City. In 1966, Don released his most famous song "Tiny Bubbles." His subsequent album also entitled *Tiny Bubbles* was on the Album Top 200 for almost a year. A bronze statue of Don stands in Waikiki's International Market Place.
