Parents Maikeli and Vaké Wolfgramm immigrated to America from Tonga and had 17 children, two of whom were adopted (Eddie and Eugene). The family are members of the Mormon Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Eight became The Jets, a family band based in Minneapolis, Minnesota that began performing in 1977. From 1985 to 1990, they went on three world tours and had five Top 10 hits on the "Billboard Hot 100." Songs by The Jets strive to express pride in their Tongan American heritage. Once, they donated all proceeds from a concert to Eastern Arizona College Fine Arts to support their Polynesian college students. On April 9, 2010, The Jets had their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary reunion show in Minneapolis and then went to the Philippines to perform and celebrate their 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary. As of 2022, there are two touring groups of Jets: The Jets (Elizabeth, Eddie, Kathi, and Moana) and The Jets Original Family Band (Haini, LeRoy, and Rudy).
