Leehom is a singer, songwriter, actor, producer, and film director. He is the second of three sons of parents from Taiwan who came to America in the 1960s to study. He began taking violin lessons at the age of six. He then learned piano and taught himself to play the guitar. At one time he worked several jobs to buy a secondhand drum kit. Rejecting Yale and Princeton, Leehom chose to attend Williams College (1998) and Berklee College of Music (2016) where he later received honorary

doctoral degrees. When Leehom visited his grandparents in Taiwan in 1995, he participated in a talent contest and caught the attention of a music label. He soon became a rising star in the Chinese idol market. Many record-breaking songs and albums followed, with just as many awards. They are too many to name and list here. Leehom earned the title of "King of Chinese Pop" from CNN (2018). He fused pop, hip-hop, R&B, and traditional Chinese music to revolutionize the music world. Leehom is an environmental activist.
